Play Day

The Play Day on the 18th of May looked at the" Musical Works of Shakespeare". Many songs are included in Shakespeare's plays although modern productions often just speak the lyrics. "O Willow" was an example of a song that was popular in Shakespeare's time but the lyrics were changed slightly to suit the purpose in Othello. Others include "O Mistress Mine" from "Twelfth Night" and "Blow Thou Winter Wind" from "As You Like It".



After the break we looked at the long shadow of Shakespeare with examples of the way he inspired composers. Purcell turned "The Tempest" into an opera (not unlike the way a good story goes from stage to film these days). Mendelssohn used Midsummer Night's Dream. Schubert lived centuries after Shakespeare but used Shakespeare's words for "Who is Sylvia".

Community Concert at St Joseph's Mundingburra

Members of the Recorder Society took part in the 2014 Community Concert at St Joseph's Church in Mundingburra on 25 May 2014. Adult members of the Society played Confesse by John Playford English Dancing Master (1651) arranged by Marj Hall for Quartet and Valerie's students representing the consorts of the two St Joseph's Schools played the William Tell Overture, Sunny Island and Singing in the Rain.
