Theme: The Way the Wind Blows.

Ruth says: "Bring your recorders to this island paradise where we will work together to find a common sound exploring music which reflects our daily lives. Music from a piece about fresh straws 13th century Paris through the centuries to music of contemporary Australia will be included. There will be music for all levels of player which will be challenging and enticing. You will make new recorder friends and will enjoy making music in a relaxed and unique environment bathed by gentle breezes. Music that reflects our daily lives."

Provisional Schedule

The main programme is on Saturday and Sunday 13 and 14 July 2019.

On Friday afternoon (3pm to 5pm), come and listen to local experts talk about the beautiful flora and fauna specific to Magnetic Island.

Following this will be an informal meet and greet on the evening of Friday 12 July 2019 with some recorder playing.

Saturday (warm up 8.30 am) is all day workshop with breakout sessions. This year we are holding a concert (7.30pm for 1 hour) which will be open to the Magnetic Island Community audience. Ruth and Ryan are happy to prepare a contribution and perform a variety of solos and duets to show the recorder in a good light! The first half of the concert will be items performed by local and invited guests.

Sunday workshops (warm up 8.30) will wind up at 3pm. This will then give us time to pack up and catch the ferry to Townsville and attend the Barrier Reef Orchestra's concert at 5pm. https://nqorchestra.com.au/
